The aim of the RSPB is the conservation of wild birds and their habitats. It is the largest non-governmental organisation in Europe.

Income is generated through membership subscription, direct and indirect sales, collecting box schemes and grants – particularly Objective One which funded the 'Aren't Welsh Birds Brilliant!' project.

Local people involve themselves through volunteering, conservation projects and membership.

Sympathetic management is promoted through the creation and maintenance of sustainable natural environments for birds that ensure the enhancement of biodiversity and aim to improve the quality of life of people and communities in Wales – the key to sustainability. This takes place both directly, through management of nature reserves, or indirectly, through RSPB Cymru's advisory work.

Education in sustainability is promoted by means of events, field teaching and visiting reserves or a bird spectacle.

The RSPB has developed a wide range of green policies concerning biodiversity, energy, transport, climate change, agriculture, water policy, planning, education and lifelong learning.

In Gwynedd the RSPB manages the Mawddach valley nature reserve. It also undertakes field teaching activities here through local schools and off-site work through events and local conservation projects.

RSPB Cymru works with land owners and land managers to promote the sympathetic management of populations of key bird species in Gwynedd.
